A bevy of comedians, including **Tom Papa**, **Rich Vos** and **Colin Quinn**, will headline "Change the World With Laughter," a live, multi-platform charity event unfolding tomorrow night at Gotham Comedy Club.

The concert, which will also feature **Rachel Feinstein**, **Gary Gulman** and **Bonnie McFarlane**, will benefit **Off the Mat, Into the World**, a yoga-based charity whose aim is to "activate leaders who want to make a difference around the world." Funds raised will go to OTM's Global Seva projects (creating stability in Haiti through local projects) and will also benefit the Empowered Youth Initiative. It's all being produced by **Transforming the World Through Comedy**.

The concert begins at 8 p.m. at Gotham Comedy Club (208 West 23rd) – and will be staged simultaneously at comedy clubs in Chicago (at Zanies Comedy Club) and LA (at The Improv in Hollywood).

Bobby Slayton, **Dwayne Kennedy**, **Pat Tomasulo**, **Michael Issac** and **Pat McGann** are scheduled to appear in LA, while **Marc Maron**, **Jeff Ross**, **Retta**, **Wayne Federman** and **Ben Morrison** will be in Chicago.

And . . . fledgling Queens comedy club **The Laughing Devil**, which I've written about several times in this column, is targeting Friday, Dec. 16 as its opening night. "The walls are painted, the signage has been ordered and the bar is built," says club owner (and comedian) **Steve Hofstetter**. "We're now in the process of hiring our staff, and our first few weeks of shows are booked." Laughingdevil.com has more info.

Graphic novel fans will definitely want to check out "Soul Stealer," the new, limited-edition offering penned by "One Life to Live" co-star **Michael Easton** (John McBain).

Illustrated by **Christopher Shy**, "Soul Stealer," published by Blackwatch Comics, is comprised of the "Soul Stealer" trilogy ("The Beaten and the Damned," "Blood and Rain" and "Last to Die") and also includes an afterword and cover gallery. It's been described by Ain't It Cool News as "Graphic novel of the year." Easton and Shy signed 1,000 copies of the book.

Easton, a New Yorker who authored the "Soul Stealer" trilogy, collaborated last year with acclaimed horror author **Peter Straub** on the best-selling graphic novel, "The Green Woman" (DC/Vertigo), which was illustrated by **John Bolton**.

Easton played the nude model who caught Ally's (**Calista Flockhart**) eye on "Ally McBeal" and was a series regular on "VR5," "Two," "413 Hope Street" and "Total Recall 2070."

* **Kideo** has created an iPad line of apps based on the PBS series, "**Between the Lions**."
